Trainers biography:

Jonathan worked as a Covert Internet Investigator, within the Metropolitan Police Child Abuse Investigation Command 10 years. This role involved the creation of online profiles of children within Social Networking Sites to locate and interact with online Predatory Paedophiles. The creation of such profiles and the interaction with online paedophiles within Social Networking Sites, Instant Messaging Services and Chat facilities has resulted in the successful prosecution of a large number of suspects between 2007 - 2009.

Jonathan became the lead covert internet investigator within the UK as regards online paedophile activity, and as such now lectures, presents and advises to law enforcement, academics and parents on the dangers of online sexual grooming. Jonathan also offers specific advice to schools and parents, as to how to children can be protected whilst using Social Networking Sites and MSN. This allows him to speak with authority on how Chat Facilities, Instant Messaging Services, Social Networking Sites and File Sharing Systems work, and how they are specifically used by Online Child Sexual Predators.

Since 2007 Jonathan has been training UK and European Law enforcement on how the internet is used by online sexual predators, and how this can be policed successfully. This training was conducted with the Metropolitan Police, other UK Police Forces through National Policing Improvement Agency (NPIA), and European Police Forces through Interpol.

Jonathan previously worked on a Child Protection Team for 4 years being involved in many protracted complex multi-agency child abuse investigations.

He has appeared on BBC Breakfast TV and BBC 24 as an Internet Safety Expert, and took part in a 12 hr Live Radio show for Internet Safety Day on 8th February 2011. He currently works as a Child Protection Consultant, specializing in Internet Safety and offender online methodology, and acts as an Expert Witness.
